

Dividing by 6

4th Grade

Every $\div 6$ fact, with the multiplication that proves each one.

Divide by 2, then by 3. It divides by both 2 and 3.

Division	=	Check it
6 $\div$ 6	1	$1 \times 6 = 6$
12 $\div$ 6	2	$2 \times 6 = 12$
18 $\div$ 6	3	$3 \times 6 = 18$
24 $\div$ 6	4	$4 \times 6 = 24$
30 $\div$ 6	5	$5 \times 6 = 30$
36 $\div$ 6	6	$6 \times 6 = 36$
42 $\div$ 6	7	$7 \times 6 = 42$
48 $\div$ 6	8	$8 \times 6 = 48$
54 $\div$ 6	9	$9 \times 6 = 54$
60 $\div$ 6	10	$10 \times 6 = 60$

Divisibility test for 6: It divides by both 2 and 3.
