

More, Less, Same

Kindergarten

Comparing two groups without counting them first.

You can often tell which group has more just by looking. Counting confirms it.

1

LINE THEM UP

Put the two groups side by side, one item against one item.

2

LOOK FOR LEFTOVERS

Whichever row keeps going has more.

3

SAY IT

"This row has more. That row has less."

4

IF THEY END TOGETHER

They are the same — equal.

5

NOW COUNT

Count both to check what your eyes told you.

EXAMPLE

5 apples against 3 pears

Two apples have no partner

So there are more apples — 2 more

Matching one-to-one is more reliable than counting for a five-year-old.
