Inverter-based generation changes the physics, not only the fuel.

What is different

Output follows weather, not demand

Inverters give little natural inertia

Generation sits closer to the load

Fault current from inverters is limited

Forecasting becomes an operational task

Measures in use

Storage and demand response shift energy

Synthetic inertia from inverter control

Network reinforcement and better forecasting

Curtailment when the network cannot absorb

Interconnectors pool variability over an area
